

Policy context

National Preventive Health Strategy 2021-30

National

Health Strategy

Launched by Minister on 13 December 2021

Focus area: Boosting action to reduce tobacco use and nicotine addiction.

Target: Reduce the daily smoking rate among Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people aged 15 years and over to 27% or less by 2030



Policy context

National Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Health Plan 2021-2031



Publicly released in December 2021

Focussing on prevention Priority 4: Health promotion

 Implement culturally safe and responsive solutions to prevent the uptake of tobacco use





Government Announcement of TIS Program extension

TIS extension announced by Minister Hunt on 28/12/2021

Investment of \$187.8 million over 4 years (\$46.95m annual)

Australian Government is committed to achieving the NPHS target of 27% or less by 2030

TIS is one of several programs that support this aim

Achieving national TIS coverage

ANU impact evaluation & research:


- TIS is having the desired impact on community attitudes and behaviours
- Gaps in TIS geographic coverage, inc remote
- Gaps in population coverage, estimated 75%

TIS Program changes:


- Expand regional TIS network & increase funding
- Redefine TIS regions as per ABS Indigenous regions (IREGs)
- Prioritise TIS activities that expand reach (i.e. population health)
- Improve arrangements for national reach and priority projects
- Improve national support for TIS workforce development priorities



Achieving national coverage through regional population health service delivery Current TIS regions ABS Indigenous regions











TIS priority group – remote regions






TIS priority group – Smoking during pregnancy





TIS priority group – Preventing youth uptake

Goal #10 – Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander youth aged 15-17 year-olds who have never smoked from 77% to 91%



Proportion of 18-24 year-olds who smoked daily:



50% in 2004-05





36% in 2018-19

Strengthening focus on population health approaches
