TIS Lead Organisations must submit reports to DSS by the due dates, one per IREG:

- Activity Work Plan & Budget
- Performance Report including an Income and Expenditure Statement
- Financial Acquittal Report, Financial Declaration and Audited Income and Expenditure Statement

AWP/Budget and Performance Report's to be submitted in draft to NBPU no later than one month prior to the DSS due date.

Tackling smoking and vaping, and improving cancer outcomes

\$263.8m Lung Cancer Screening (over 4 years)

The 2023-24 Budget provided a total of \$737million through the Department of Health and Aged Care committed to Tackling smoking, and vaping, and improving cancer outcomes.

This budget provides strong action aimed directly at reducing smoking and vaping rates – particularly among young Australians – through stronger legislation, enforcement, education and support.

\$29.5m Support smoking & vaping cessation (over 4 years)
