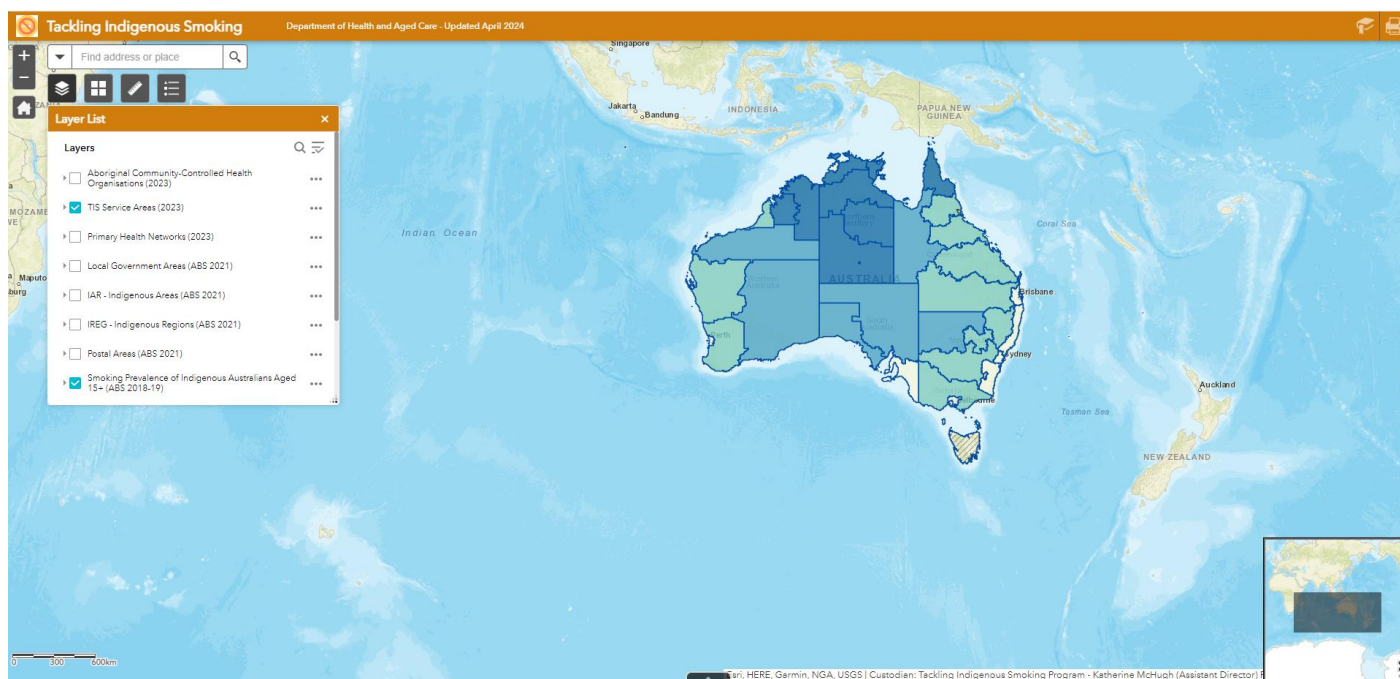


# Tackling Indigenous Smoking map instructions

Welcome to the Tackling Indigenous Smoking (TIS) online map instructions. These instructions are a handy reference for learning how to use the map and the tools to help you do things like move around the map, measure distances, search for an address, investigate the TIS Regional Tobacco Control Group (RTCG) service areas and other information. (RTCGs are organisations funded by the Australian Government to help reduce smoking rates among First Nations peoples.)

Using Google Chrome as your web browser is the best option. Other browsers will work but are slower. The map will look like this when open:




The information provided by the map is organised into 'layers'. Each layer is an interactive picture that you can tick on and off to see the visual information. Two layers are automatically selected when the map first opens. These are:






- TIS Service Areas (2023)
- Smoking Prevalence of Indigenous Australians Aged 15+ (ABS 2018-19)

The 'TIS Service Areas (2023)' layer contains all the TIS RTCG service area boundaries, and the 'Smoking Prevalence of Indigenous Australians Aged 15+ (ABS 2018-19)' layer indicates the percentage of Indigenous Australians aged 15+ who were daily smokers in 2018-19.

To close the Layer List, click on the 'x' in the top right-hand corner of the pop-up screen.

## How to use the tools

	<b>Home control</b> – Zooms to Australia. Click this if you want to go back to the original Australia-wide image.
	<b>Zoom in and out</b> – Zoom in/out of the map. Alternatively, use the scroll wheel on your mouse to zoom in and out.

	<p>You can hold down 'Shift' and drag the arrow to select an area you want to zoom in to.</p>
	<p><b>Find address or place</b> – Search for a location.</p> <p>This searches for Indigenous and non-Indigenous names.</p> <p>You can type an address in the search bar. Once you start typing, a list of suggested locations appears. You can select from these individual options using your mouse, or the down arrow then pressing 'Enter'. The map will then zoom to that location.</p>
	<p><b>Basemap gallery</b> – you can add a background map to see various map views such as roads, towns, geographic features etc.</p>
	<p><b>Measure tool</b> – you can measure distances or areas using the tool. After you have selected one of the three measurement functions to use, you can change the measure unit by selecting the drop down arrow next to the measurement unit.</p> <p><u>To measure a distance</u>, click on the distance icon.</p> <p>Mouse click where you want to measure from, then mouse click every time you want to pin down the measuring tape and change direction. End the measurement with a mouse double-click. The distance is shown in the Measurement toolbox (see below). You may need to press the 'Ctrl' key on your keyboard to activate the tool.</p>  <p><u>To measure an area</u>, use the Area tool.</p> <p>Mouse click at one point of the area boundary you wish to measure and move the mouse and click to pin the measuring line and to change the area shape. Double-click to finish. This will give you the area in square kilometres. You may need to press the 'Ctrl' key on your keyboard to activate the tool.</p>

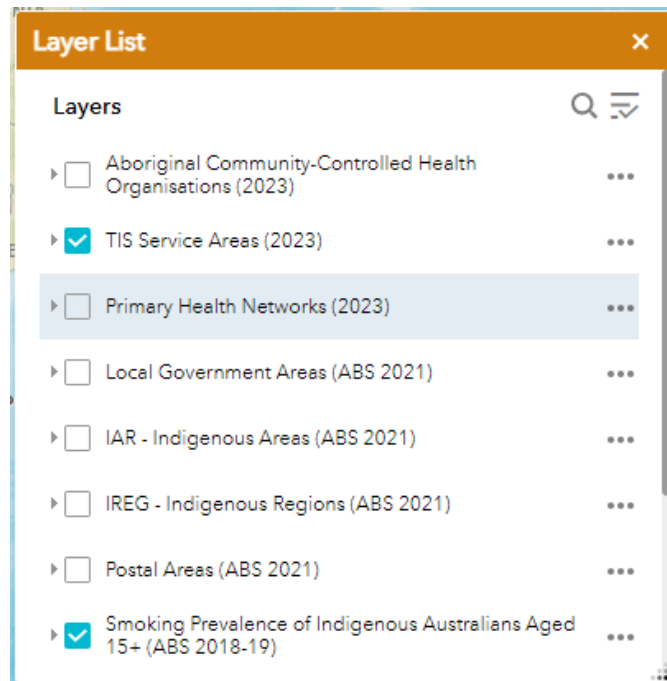


To measure a coordinate, use the Location tool.

You can see the Latitude and Longitude of one or two locations. Mouse click on the point that you would like to coordinates of. If you would like coordinates of a second location, move the cursor to the second area and mouse click again. The details will be on the pop-up Measurement box.



**Layer List tool** – All the data layers in the map can be turned on or off.








Click the dropdown arrow next to the layer name to expand it. This will show the legend for the layer.

To show or hide a layer, tick the box next to it.



**Legend** - Shows the symbols used for each of the layers you switched on. For example, if the TIS service areas and Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisations (2023) layers are selected, the Legend will show the TIS service areas as blue lines and ACCHOS as pink dots.

	<p><b>Bookmarks</b> – Pre-saved areas which you can zoom to by selecting them in the list under Bookmarks.</p>
	<p><b>Print/Save</b> – Print and/or save the current map view. Choose your format and layout from the drop-down list. Use the 'Advanced' button for more options.</p>
<p>See the bottom right-hand corner</p> 	<p><b>Map extent</b> – Shows what part of the map you are viewing. The map extent feature is in the bottom right-hand corner of the map and indicates the part of the map that you are currently viewing in the main view.</p>
<p>See this arrow at bottom of Map</p> 	<p><b>Data Table</b> – This shows the data that is used in the layer/s that you have selected. To show the data, click the arrow at the bottom of the screen with the relevant layer/s selected. Note that if multiple layers are switched on there will be a tab for each layer. You can select a row by clicking on the box next to it – this will highlight it and you can then zoom to it. Note that only features in the current map view will be shown – you can show all features by clicking off the 'Filter by Map Extent' option.</p>
	<p><b>Marker</b> – Markers can be placed at a selected point/s for easy identification of location if you change the zoom, layers, or in comparison to other marker/s. Markers may assist with the measurement function. Move the cursor to any location where you would like to place a marker. Right mouse click. Select the three dots on the bottom right and choose '+ Add a marker'. If desired, add as many markers as you would like. You can right click on a marker to see the Longitude and Latitude. To remove a marker, right mouse click on an existing marker and select the three dots on the bottom right corner of the pop-up box. Select 'X Remove marker'.</p>

## Quick guide for common tasks

### See the extent of a TIS RCTG service area.

Select the layer 'TIS Service Areas (2023)'. Click on the TIS area of interest and a pop-up window will show the organisation's name.



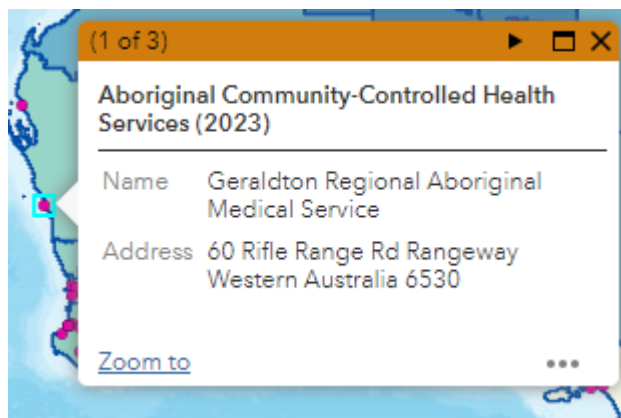
Click on 'Zoom to' to go to the full extent of the TIS area in the map.

### Find out the information in an area.

With your selected layer/s on, click on a symbol or area that you are interested in. A pop-up box will appear, containing the information related to the symbol or area that you have selected.

If you have multiple layers selected, and you click on a relevant area on the map, a pop-up box will show you information for each selected layer.

For example, if you have four layers selected, the pop-up will display 1 of 4 in the top left corner. You can move through the information for each layer using the arrow at the top right of the pop-up.



Click on the three dots on the bottom right and then select 'View Attributable Table' to see the data that is behind the map.
